authors such as orality the mother tongue the recollection of the delights of early education literality freedom in interpretation absence of teleology the beauties of ornamentation and amplification a reduced preoccupation with the fixity of the text the pleasure of making mistakes dialogue with the other the extension of desire original simplicity and new and more flexible forms of authority
